Citizenship & Immigration

This report summarizes citizenship and immigration data collected during the 2011 National Household Survey for Wellington, Dufferin, and Guelph (WDG). In 2011, there were 41,150 immigrants in WDG, with more than half of all immigrants (24,885 individuals) living in the City of Guelph. WDG was also home to 1,125 non-permanent residents of Canada.

of residents are third generation (or more) Canadians. 32.4%


of Dufferin's recent immigrants were born in the United Kingdom.

of immigrants were under the age of 5 at the time of immigration.


Top 10 Countries of Birth for Immigrants in WDG





Note: Direct comparisons cannot be made between the 2006 Census Long-Form data and the 2011 National Household Survey, which replaced the Long-Form. The 2006 Census Long-Form was <u>mandatory</u> while the new 2011 National Household Survey was <u>voluntary</u>. Due to this change in methodology, the 2011 sample may be subject to underreporting, or non-response bias, from individuals of certain subgroups who are less likely to respond to surveys.

Top Three Countries of Birth for Recent Immigrants




WDG Immigrants by Age at Time of Immigration
