

- Interactive: Flexible to the needs of the user



HOW TO NAVIGATE THE INTERACTIVE DATA PAGES





Filters

Filtering allows the user to explore subsets and cross-sections of the data.

Click on the geography filters to select subsets of the data. For example, if you click on 'Dufferin' in the 'Census Sub Division' filter, the Dufferin region is highlighted in the map, along with its municipalities, which can also be selected by clicking on them. If '2006 Population' is selected from the Select Year filter, only data from 2006 is retrieved.

To select multiple options, press the 'control key' while clicking on your selections

To de-select options, click on them again.

Click on a municipality and it is highlighted. Click on it again to return to the full map.

Buttons



Question marks signal that more information is available about a topic or visual. Simply hover your cursor over the question mark or click on it.



Click on the Arrow icon to move to the previous screen.



Click on the Home icon to return to the main page.


