## Annual learning/networking event

Following up on the Leads' meeting on June 3<sup>rd</sup>, it was reiterated that the CDP would continue to hold in-person annual meetings, but open attendance to all members, rather than simply Leads. The Community Data Program will be co-hosting an in-person learning & networking event on May 8 and 9, 2025 in Thunder Bay, Ontario in partnership with Northern Policy Institute. #### T1FF Working Poverty tables

There was some room in the budget, so we will be getting 2021 and 2022 updates of these tables. The 2021 data should arrive around the end of July or beginning of August and the 2022 data should arrive a few weeks after that.

The **Longitudinal Immigration Database** (**IMDB) update** will likely not arrive until end of the summer at the earliest.

## **Labour Force Survey tables**

We receive annual tables (typically in January) from the Labour Force Survey at the Economic Region (ER) and CMA levels:

- Table 1: duration of unemployment x age x sex
- Table 2: median/avg hourly wage x NAICS x age x sex
- Table 3: median/avg hourly wage x NOC x age x sex
- Table 4: LFS estimates x age groups x sex
- Table 5: characteristics (counts of self-employed, part-time, full-time, temporary) x age x sex

We are going to submit a cost estimate request to expand the tables to include some additional concepts:

- Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimates by highest level of educational attainment [MAKE MORE CLEAR]
- Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimates by industry, North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) 2017
- Wages for employee employees by industry, North American Industry Classification System (NAICS)
   2017, and type of work (Total, full-time, part-time)

Please let us know if there are other variables that you would like to see introduced into the LFS tables we receive. This dictionary of concepts and definitions gives an idea of what is available from the survey: https://www150.statcan.gc.ca/n1/pub/71-543-g/71-543-g2020001-eng.htm#a3

There is no guarantee that we will acquire an expanded set of tables, but we are interested to know what members could use. The tables will not be acquired until next program year, so feedback can be submitted over the next few months.

Vancouver: Wage groupings, ideally to match up with provincial and local living wage.

#### Measuring childcare spaces

With significant funding being invested in childcare, there is interest in being able to accurately measure the number of childcare spaces available and the number of children in childcare. Looking at the Canadian Business Counts, there is significant discrepancy at the provincial level between the NAICS classification of childcare services (624410 - Child day-care services) and the counts of childcare facilities by the Canadian Survey on the Provision of Child Care Services. This is to be expected, but it was hoped that the Canadian Business Counts could serve as some sort of proxy measure.

Simcoe: Note that the licenced capacity will differ from the operating capacity.

Vancouver: for childcare we get data from the regional health authority that licenses them--would be challenging but maybe possible to scale across the country?

Kawartha Lakes and Haliburton: Canadian Business Counts doesn't include non profit child care centres (which in Kawartha Lakes and Haliburton is all non profit).

## Measuring the gig economy
